101–150 Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (36–55 µg/m ³)	People who are unusually sensitive to air pollution may experience health effects if exposed for 24 hours. General public not likely to be affected.										
151–200 Unhealthy (56–150 µg/m ³)	People who are sensitive to air pollution may experience more serious health effects if exposed for 24 hours. Everyone else may begin to experience health effects.										
201–300 Very Unhealthy (151–250 µg/m ³)	Health Alert: everyone may experience more serious health effects if exposed for 24 hours.										
301–500 Hazardous (251–500 µg/m ³)	Health Warning: emergency conditions where everyone is more likely to be affected if exposed for 24 hours.
