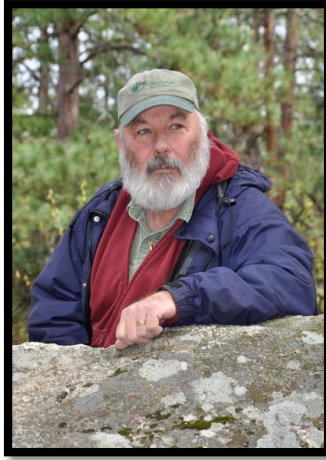


“Beneath our feet: The geological story of Northeast Washington”
